Intoduction

The School-centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) programme is a one year full-time course which enables you to train and develop your skills in the classroom.

Our teacher training is ideal for people who want to make a difference in their community and learn on the job from day one. As a trainee, you'll be interacting every day with young children and working as a member of teaching staff in a nursery or primary school local to you.

Our research-led programme is designed to give you plenty of practical experience as well as subject specific training and a deep understanding of effective teaching methods.

You will be in the classroom from the start of September and will benefit from the support of an experienced mentor throughout your training.

At the end of the programme, you'll be awarded qualified teacher status (QTS) and Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).

Learn on the job from day one

By choosing our programme, you will benefit from hands-on experience at two or more schools and learn from experienced teaching professionals.

Our curriculum focuses on supporting you to put learning into practice and places you in school four days a week from early September until the end of the summer term.

Our programme includes opportunities to experience additional educational settings later in the year to make sure you qualify with broad teaching experience.

Mentoring & support

You'll be eased into teaching by shadowing other expert teachers, before leading your own lessons with guidance from more experienced colleagues. You'll work with a skilled and knowledgeable phase-specific mentor who will meet with you regularly to give you guidance. Your lead mentor will deliver your training and oversee your progress throughout the year.

Your mentors also receive support and training from CREC and Teach First to ensure they are briefed on the latest research and can tailor their coaching to suit your needs.

Specialised Training

Before you enter the classroom we'll give you two weeks of intensive training focused on core areas such as behaviour management and planning. You will also have a further two separate weeks of intensive training later in the year.

Once you start placement, you will have weekly training sessions, designed by CREC and Teach First's experts and sequenced to ensure focus on areas of teaching that are most relevant to that point in the academic year.

You will take part in six modules across the year - one per half term. In each module you will have self-directed study sessions, live seminars and time to collaborate with other trainees at CREC.

Your self-directed study sessions will cover a comprehensive range of topics:

- Subject knowledge and pedagogy
- An inclusive classroom environment
- Effective and inclusive teaching
- · Planning and curriculum
- Effective assessment.

Live seminars will be held for each module and are tailored to teaching in EYFS and KS1. Each module will also include a full day conference which will focus on a combination of core curriculum and subject or phase-specific content. The conferences also provide a great opportunity to meet other trainees on the programme.

The qualifications you'll receive

When you complete your training, you'll be awarded qualified teacher status (QTS) by Teach First. You'll also achieve Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) meaning you'll have a 60 credit Master's level certificate in the study of education.

Eligibility

To be eligible to apply you will need:

- an undergraduate degree or equivalent
- to demonstrate sufficient knowledge in the area of early childhood education, either through your degree qualification, your A levels or relevant experience.
- grade C or above in English, Maths and Science GCSEs, or equivalent qualification.

We accept most equivalency test providers.

Overseas qualifications will be reviewed by the UK national agency of international qualifications and skills (ENIC) to ensure they meet programme requirements.

International candidates will need the right to study in the UK. You already have this, for example, if you:

- · are an Irish citizen
- have settled or pre-settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme
- have indefinite leave to remain in the UK.

We are not able to sponsor Visa applications to study on this course.




Course accessibility

The PGCE is a challenging course and applicants need a wide range of skills, knowledge, experiences, and an aptitude for teaching. It will require the trainees to hone the skills of reflection, critical thinking and adaptability to be able to meet the ever developing world of education with confidence, resilience and creativity.

We are committed to training teachers who have the ability to recognise, value and exploit the benefits and advantages offered by this course and draw upon them to inform their practice. Moreover, whilst the focus is to produce competent, reflective teachers, the programme also places emphasis on the ability to articulate a personal philosophy and professional values, and the opportunity to develop key transferable skills such as team work and autonomy.

Fees and financial support

The course fees for UK students in 2024 to 2025 are £9,250.

You will be registered as a full-time student throughout the programme, with access to lots of student benefits, as well as a student loan to cover your fees, subject to eligibility. You may also be eligible for a bursary or grant to support you throughout your training.
